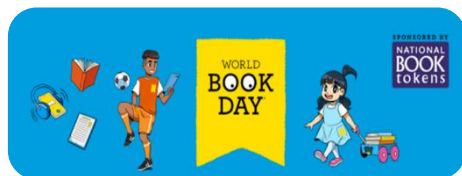

## **PARKING AND WAITING OUTSIDE SCHOOL**

Complaints have been received concerning parked vehicles causing a danger and an obstruction to **children**, residents, businesses, other road users, and pedestrians outside Bozeat school.

**PLEASE DO NOT** park your vehicles where it would cause any inconvenience, endangerment, or obstruction to anyone else including obstructing driveways, paths and dropped kerbs.

**IT IS AN OFFENCE/HIGHWAY**

**CODE TO PARK:**

(Unless in an authorised parking space)

- Highway code states within 10 metres of a junction
- Opposite a traffic island
- At or near a bus stop or taxi rank
- On a pedestrian crossing
- In an area marked by zig-zag or double yellow lines

Please do not park partially or wholly on the pavement...this can cause an obstruction for pedestrians including your children, prams, pushchairs, and wheelchair users.

**Officers and Traffic Wardens will be patrolling in your  
School area vehicle registration numbers will be taken**

**Parking tickets may be issued or vehicles removed**

Standard parking/obstruction offences incur a fine.  
Parking on zig-zag lines incurs a fine and 3 penalty points.
